

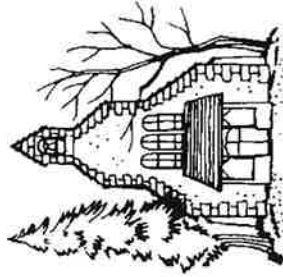
GOOD TO KNOW

- ✓ Your giving is between you, God, and the Church Treasurer. We use codes in our bookkeeping to identify givers and to protect their privacy.
- ✓ Payments can be made at intervals of your choosing, so you also can plan them based on the pattern of your income.
- ✓ The money can be transferred to either of our Postfinance accounts, or paid in at the counter, or given in an envelope in the collection.
- ✓ Payments to St [redacted] Church are not eligible for tax relief, however tax relief is available if you give to the Association, and you will receive automatic annual tax receipts.
- ✓ Giving can be to either the Church or the Association or split between both.

THE DIFFERENCE

- ✧ St [redacted] Church is responsible for the Ministry side of our Mission, except the charitable giving. Most of our costs are borne by the Church.
- ✧ The Association was set up at the suggestion of the Tax authorities in order to enable tax relief, and is responsible for the building fabric, pastoral work and charitable giving.

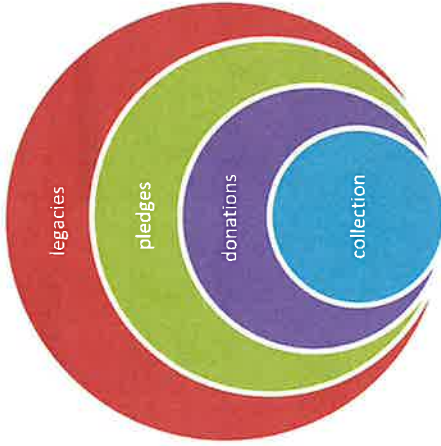
Our Church was built in 1906. Since then we have grown and now have a multinational and diverse congregation, united in their love of Christ.
