20:00 **Cultural Evening with Elin Teilus** a Sámi singer, yoiker (a traditional form of song/cultural expression) and touring artist from Sweden. She is described as a force of nature, with a unique presence and magical voice, a bringer of the beautiful traditional music of the Sámi people into new worlds. At the heart of her artistry is the love of the Earth and all the living. The music encapsulates grand sceneries and at the same time remaining intimately close, always with elements of free creation. Hearing her sing is like sitting by the fire watching stories of the ancient ones come alive. Elin invites you to remember the untouched, sacred connection with life that dwells in human beings. The *Cultural Council of Västra Götaland* notes "... Within Elin Teilus' music the Sámi tradition of storytelling is alive; Listen to her joik and you will meet the reindeers, the clear water of the cold well... It brings hope for the understanding and respect of the Sámi identity and history."
