Young Adults Gathering - Prague





5 YEAR CHLDREN, YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS STRATEGY

You may remember that the Diocese has commissioned Youthscape to undertake research into Children and Youth Ministry across Europe. So far they have completed 2 stages. A survey of all chaplaincies and a survey of Youth workers across the Diocese. A summary of the findings are below. The final stage is to survey young people themselves.

- 76% of the 108 chaplaincies that responded in Phase 1 have at least 5 young people and are providing some age-specific ministry for them but less than half (42%) of chaplaincies have someone with designated responsibility for this ministry
- In relation to life for young people, respondents across all chaplaincies spoke about: 'third culture' kids, the transient nature of lives, busy culture, academic pressures, the challenges to their ministries of geographical distances between churches and communities, and language barriers
- Very few chaplaincies are currently offering individualised or outreach-focussed youth ministry, instead, the most common offering is the opportunity to serve in the church, followed by all-age services, and regular group activities during the church service.
- The most common barriers to the development of youth ministry for chaplaincies is the lack of volunteers, small congregation numbers, geographically disparate communities, and the transient nature of individuals and families
- 23% of respondents in Phase 2 identified a desire to work in partnership with other churches and through survey comments and interviews, several individuals suggested that Diocesan support to work collaboratively could support the development of youth ministry
- Suggestions for Diocesan support were grouped according to practical, personal development, and financial. The most common suggestions were:
- Practical: provision of resources e.g. curriculum, volunteer training resources regional/online events, and provision of advice or guidance;
- Personal Development: youth ministry skills learning from best practice, networking with other youth workers, mentoring / coaching and vision and strategy support;
- None of the respondents in Phase 2 felt young people had 'a lot' of influence over vision and strategy

Once the final Stage of the research has been completed the information will be used to formulate a strategy for Children, youth and young adults ministry across the Diocese which will be funded for at least 5 years.
